## ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

Advanced Placement tests are given in May. The Montville Board of Education funds one-half the cost of Advanced Placement exams. Each Advanced Placement exam cost \$80; therefore, it is expected that students taking AP tests pay a fee of \$40 per AP exam. **This must be received by the School Counseling office no later than September 29.**

Payment should be in the form of a check made out to "**Montville High School**". Please list the AP courses for which payment is being made on the check. If there is a hardship situation in paying for the exam, it is important that you see me about this as soon as possible. No student should decide not to take the AP exam because of inability to pay.

Some AP courses are also University of Connecticut ECE (Early College Experience) courses. Registration for UConn credit through these courses has been completed; if there are any changes please see Dr. Phillips immediately.

Please review carefully the following policy regarding AP or UConn ECE course testing:

- Students enrolled in a course that is only AP or ECE must take the exam in that course.

- Students signing up for an AP test must pay \$40 to cover half the cost of the test, payable to Montville High School (the Board of Education covers the rest) by September 29.
- Students enrolling in courses that are **both** AP and UConn ECE may take **either** AP or ECE exams, **or both**.
- Students choosing to earn UConn credit for an AP/ECE or ECE course must have registered with The University of Connecticut through my office.

**PSAT INFORMATION**

**The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) will be given to all juniors on Wednesday, October 18, from 7:35-10:35**

This is an excellent practice test for the SAT Reasoning Test, which is required by most colleges, and is also the qualifying test for the National Merit scholarships. The PSAT provides a comprehensive assessment of critical reading, mathematical reasoning, and writing skills. The student report provides question-by-question analysis along with specific suggestions on how to improve academic skills.

**Montville Public Schools is paying the cost of the PSAT for all juniors, and they are automatically registered.**

Juniors will be receiving a descriptive booklet along with a practice PSAT shortly.

On October 18, all juniors are to report to assigned areas at the first homeroom bell for the testing, which will last through Blocks 1 and 2 and end before the first lunch period.
